They joined St. Ann Catholic Church, made friends and began a new life of retirement. Millie joined a quilting group and loved spending time with these ladies. She spent time with the loves of her life: family, quilting, and baseball. From the time she was a child she had a love for baseball and through the years developed a wealth of knowledge that would amaze even the biggest baseline enthusiast. This new chapter of life was a wonderful chapter.

Unfortunately, some times in life we get lemons. Millie was diagnosed with terminal cancer in June 2015. Even with that, Millie's positivity and faith drove her to fight and fight she did.
